Migration Letters is believed to fill a significant gap in migration studies as a double-blind refereed letter-type journal publishing short accounts of new original research.

Thus, being the only letter-type journal on migration, the likely subscribers are universities, research institutions, funding organisation, governmental and non-governmental national and international agencies, support groups and individuals.
